Greetings, my name is Margaret De Bodt. I am 25 years old and am from Kelowna, British Columbia Canada. Currently, however, I am living in Seosan, Chungcheongnam-do. I am writing you this letter in hopes of getting an English teaching position at your school.

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From my own experience, I have learned five other languages, not including English. While my skills in those languages are not anywhere near fluent, I have a lot of experience in having to learn a language that is not my own. As well, from having to learn another language, I have had to, in a way, re-learn English and take a look at English. From this, I can relate to and understand anyone's troubles and difficulties learning English. I know it is not an easy language to learn and will take a lot of effort in order to learn, let alone master it.

From this, I can say that I wish students to become more comfortable in learning and speaking English and gain a sense of confidence in it. I believe it is more important for students to be comfortable and confident in a language rather to push for perfection. Learning a language is not easy and can be harder for some individuals. And when talking to other people in English, it is better to know how to get your ideas/thoughts across, even if it is not 100% perfect. Also, by not pushing for a perfect learning, it will allow students to be more relaxed in the classroom and perhaps more willing to try and learn the language. Confidence is another key area in learning a language. A person with a decent language skill and high sense of confidence can communicate better then a person with a high language skill and low sense of confidence.

As a teacher, I believe I can always learn more things and improve my teaching ability. This is why I do my best to attend as many conferences in my off time. Here, I can attend presentations and hear new teaching ideas and methods and how to use them in the classroom. These presentations are based off their own experiences of teaching English and have already been tried and tested. Not all ideas/methods will be appropriate for me and the students I teach, but they are a good place to go to and discover these ideas and methods. Not only can I hear from other English teachers (both Korean and non-Koreans) but there are sometimes presentations from EFL companies.
